

Louis Nagel, DMA Juilliard, is Professor Emeritus of Piano and Piano Literature at the University of Michigan School of Music, Theater, and Dance. He has recorded and performed nationally and internationally to critical acclaim, and his former students are active in the music teaching profession worldwide. Winner of numerous awards, including the Harold Haugh Award for Excellence in Teaching from The University of Michigan School of Music, Dr. Nagel continues an active teaching/coaching/lecturing and performance schedule. American conductor **Kevin Fitzgerald** has been recognized as a rising talent in the next generation of conductors. He is currently serving as Music Director of Spectrum Orchestra and ÆPEX Contemporary Performance, both based in Michigan. Kevin is committed to the pursuit of artistic excellence of cutting edge programs to impact the lives of as many people and communities as possible. Harnessing the healing power of music is integral facet of Kevin's mission. In the summer of 2016, Kevin conducted and co-produced a performance of Mozart's Requiem in honor of the victims of the Pulse Nightclub shooting in Orlando, Florida. In the 48 hours following the attack, Kevin and producer Austin Stewart recruited over 300 musicians, including vocal soloists Alaina Brown, Ashley Dixon, George Shirley and Stephen West, for the performance in Hill Auditorium, Ann Arbor. Physicians for Prevention of Gun Violence (PPGV) is a Michigan physicians' organization dedicated to reducing gun violence through education, advocacy and outreach. As health care professionals who have been intimately involved in the care of gunshot wound victims and their families, we have seen the horrific physical and emotional damage that bullets cause. PPGV focuses its efforts on educating physicians, government officials, and the public; preventing children from accessing guns; supporting research, suicide awareness, and universal background checks; opposing physician "gag laws"; keeping guns out of schools, hospitals, college campuses, bars, houses of worship and other places of gathering; and eliminating military-style assault weapons from civilian use.
